




ELIGIBILITY:

- ï Active duty military, DoD civilians regularly scheduled, and reservists on active-duty status.
- ï Children who have just completed grades K-5

CAMP STRUCTURE:

- ï Campers will be based at Child Development Center (Bldg. 1207) and at the Youth Center (Bldg. 500).
- ï Weekly schedules (available in May) will include: Activities at camp, outdoor adventure, field trips, afternoon swimming at Delafield Pond and Round Pond
- ï Adult-to-Child ratio = 1:15 Kindergarten 1:12

FEES AND REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- ï Annual Child & Youth Registration: \$18/1 child; \$36/2 children; \$40/3 or more children.
- ï Registration can be completed at CDC (Bldg. 1207), OS office.
- ï CDC will begin accepting applications at 6:30am March 8-19 at the OS office (Bldg. 1207).
- ï At the time a space is offered (5-16 April 04), you will be required to pay a deposit of 50% for each camp week your child is enrolled.
- ï Meals and Snacks will be provided.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES:

ï Teens

15-20 teens are needed as camp counselors. Teens must be at least 13 years old, and have completed 8th grade. Potential counselors must complete an application (available in April), attend training, and volunteer a minimum of 2 weeks per summer. (Please contact Jodi Fillipone at 938-3727.)

MEDICATION POLICY:

- ï Administration of medication is to be coordinated with parent, Child & Youth staff, and Community Health Nurse (CHN) prior to camp beginning. Only approved medications will be administered by staff in accordance with the Child & Youth Health SOP.
- ï Exception to policy requests for other medications must be submitted to the OS director prior to the start of the program and reviewed by the Special Needs Resource Team (SNRT).
- ï Children are not authorized to carry their own medications at any time. Children requiring asthma and/or epi-pen medications must have a care plan completed by the child's physician. Parents must meet with CYS staff and CHN in May to review the care plan.
