It is only fitting that this magnificent coin be struck at the West Point Mint—the first silver commemorative coin struck at West Point since 1994. The Minter's Art

The 2002 West Point Bicentennial Commemorative Silver Dollar reverse displays a U.S. Mint engraved image of the United States Military Academy's Bicentennial Logo, featuring the Academy's beloved symbol, the helmet of Pallas Athena. The obverse depicts a West Point Color Guard in parade. The crisp beauty of the proof versions is accomplished through a unique minting process of hand-feeding burnished silver blanks into a press fitted with special proof-polished dies.
