Task Organization: See Appendix 9(Confidence Obstacle Course), 16(Zero/Qualification), 19(Engineer Training), 20(Basic Land Navigation Training), and 22(Recondo)

1. SITUATION.

- a. Enemy. See Base Order.
- b. Friendly. The Cadet Basic Training (CBT) Cadre consists of 8 Companies plus one Staff; total approximately 264 Cadets. The Cadet Field Training (CFT) I Cadre consists of 8 Companies plus one Staff; total approximately 240 Cadets. The CFTII Cadre consists of 8 Companies plus two Staffs; total approximately 260 Cadets.
- c. Attachments and detachments. CBT Leadership will have 42 TACS, and the CFT will have 24 TACS.

2. MISSION. The 1st and 2nd Class Cadet Cadre for CBT (CBT I: 18-19 June / CBT II: 10-11 July), CFT (CFT I: 9-10 June / CFT II: 2-3 July) conducts a 32 hour physically and mentally challenging team building event during the Leader's Training Program IOT build unit cohesiveness, identify strengths and weaknesses and prepare CST Cadre to lead cadets during cadet summer training.

3. EXECUTION.

- a. Intent.

Purpose: Provide a challenging, physically demanding training event for 1st and 2nd Class Cadets that focuses on individual and collective tasks to build a cohesive Chain of Command, identify strengths and weaknesses and prepare CST Cadre to lead cadets during summer training. Test the Cadets ability to react to the unknown.

Key Tasks: Develop adaptable leaders and teams
Physically and mentally demanding
Sustain military skills
Build unit cohesion and Warrior Ethos

Endstate: All Cadet Cadre prepared to assume their leadership role in CST

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b. Concept of Operation. Two groups conduct this operation in four iterations: CBT Cadet Cadre I and II and CFT Cadet Cadre I and II. Each Cadet Company Cadre moves as a group to each training site. CBT Cadet Cadre departs from Daly Field and CFT Cadet Cadre departs from Camp Buckner main parking lot on trucks to Station #1 (APPENDIX 16 Zero Range). Cadets move by trucks (Rt. Black) to Station #2 (APPENDIX 16 Qualification Range). Cadets move by trucks (Rt. Red) to Station #3 (APPENDIX 20 Basic Land Navigation). Cadets foot march (RT SLEEP) to the Bivouac site. Cadets foot march (RT KNIGHT) to Station #4 (Leader's Reaction Course). Cadets foot march (RT WATER) to Station #5 (APPENDIX 19 Boat comp). Cadets foot march (RT BLUE) to Station #6 (APPENDIX #16 Shooting comp) with an opportunity to conduct truck movement if they reach the designated link-up point in a specified time (TBD). Cadets move by trucks to Station #7 (APPENDIX 22 Water Obstacle Course). Once each Company completes station #7, Cadets complete and submit peer assessments (TAB E) prior to release. CBT Cadre returns by truck to Daly Field; CFT Cadre released from the WOC (TAB B: Movement Overlay). Final event is a HOOAH Supper in the Cadet Mess for CBT Cadre and Barth Hall for CFT Cadre to announce the competition winner.

c. Tasks to subordinate units:

- (1) Supporting Task Force and USMA Committee Chiefs plan, rehearse, and execute their committee site ISO each iteration of Warrior Challenge (paragraph 2).
- (2) Station OIC: Report to Snake Pit when each company arrives/departs and statistics (TAB D).
- (3) Each detail provides two cadets for RTO duty in the Snake Pit. Provide names to Warrior Challenge OIC at the OPORD brief. Detailed personnel report to the Snake Pit NLT 0500 the day of execution.
- (4) Each detail provides two cadets to assist at the bivouac site. Provide names to Warrior Challenge OIC at the OPORD brief. Detailed personnel report to Camp Buckner parade field NLT 2100 the day of execution.

d. Coordinating Instructions.

- (1) Cadet uniform is BDUs (patrol cap in right cargo pocket), Brown T-Shirt, Drawers, Black Socks, Standard Army Belt, ID Card, ID Tags, Boots, Kevlar, weapon, compass, West Point Map (1:50), Protractor and Ruck Sack pack IAW packing list (TAB C).
- (2) Each CBT Company, CFT Company and Staff will provide one trail vehicle for CASEVAC of injuries. Vehicle will carry a litter and 10 gallons of water for emergency use. CFTII Staff vehicle provides coverage for OHW Staff.
- (3) Training Timeline (TAB A)

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- (4) Order of movement for CBTI and II, and CFTI: Staff, A thru H. Staff and A Company move together to the First Station (Zero Range).
- (5) Order of movement for CFTII: OHW Staff, CFTII Staff, A thru H. OHW Staff and CBT Staff move together to the First Station (Zero Range).
- (6) OPORD to TAC Teams and Cadet Chain of Command (Commander and CSM or 1SG):
 - CBTI: 151900 Jun 04, Location TBD
 - CBTII: 071900 Jul 04, Location TBD
 - CFTI: 081930 Jun 04 in the Camp Buckner Theater
 - CFTII: 011930 Jul 04 in the Camp Buckner Theater

4. SERVICE AND SUPPORT.

- a. Class I:
 - (1) Ration Cycle: Each Cadet carry four MRE's. A rations for HOOAH Supper.
 - (2) Water: USMA Station OICs coordinate a Water Trailer on site.
- b. Class V: Refer to TAB G (Resource Matrix) for ammunition requirements by station.
- c. Services: USMA Station OICs coordinate Port-a-Jon(s) on site(s).

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL.

- a. Command
 - (1) Snake Pit OIC, Warrior Challenge OIC, Station OIC
 - (2) Command HQ will be at the Snake Pit.
- c. Signal:
 - (1) Each station OIC will have a Hand Held Radio.
 - (2) Frequencies assigned per SIGO prior to each iteration.
