2. MISSION. Cadet Summer Training Individual Tactics and Techniques Committee, conducts individual movement technique training for United States Military Academy cadets from 5-16 July 2004 at West Point, NY to qualify the Fourth Class cadets on Pre-Commissioning task of React to Direct and Indirect Fire, provide leadership opportunities for First and Second Class cadets, and to inspire and instill the true warrior spirit in the Army's future leaders.

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3. EXECUTION. Intent. I expect the Task Force soldiers attached to the ITT Committee to professionally provide USMA cadets with instruction, demonstrations and hands on practical application opportunities for Individual Movement Techniques. This will be executed so that all cadets leave CBT 04 inspired and confidence that they can fight and win on today's battlefield.

a. Concept of Operation. This committee will be conducted in three phases (see Base Order). The Individual Tactics and Techniques committee is responsible for the familiarization of eight cadet companies of approximately 140 cadets each on the fundamentals of Individual Movement Techniques (React to Direct and Indirect Fire, Move Over, Through, and Around Obstacles), and Move as a Buddy Team.

(1) Phase I: (01 Jan-Jun 04) begins upon receipt of this OPORD. The Committee Chief and the Task Force OIC will link up at USMA to conduct a leaders recon of the training site. The Committee Chief will give his guidance to the Task Force OIC to ensure duties and responsibilities are coordinated and times and dates are synchronized.

(2) Phase II. (01 Jun-14 Aug 04): begins with the arrival of the Augmenting TF to Camp Natural Bridge, and concludes with the last day of committee training. This phase is further broken down into the three following sub-phases:

(3) Phase IIa. Equipment draw and site set-up. This phase begins when the TF draws necessary supplies and equipment on/about 4 June 04 and site set-up on/about 5-8 June 04. Internal rehearsals will be conducted at Camp Natural Bridge and area J3 from 10-14 June 04. Phase IIa will conclude with the validation of each training lane site by the TF/USMA Command Group.

(4) Phase IIb, Execution. The cadets arrive to area J3 for training where they will receive an introduction/safety briefing from the Site OIC, the committee will then put on a demonstration of the tasks the cadets will receive during that days training. The company is then broken up into platoon size elements and goes to their respective classroom areas where they will receive three classes Move Under direct Fire, React to Indirect Fire, and Move as a Buddy Team. They will then halt training and eat chow. The last portion of training is a certification period where cadets will move as a buddy team to close with and destroy the enemy. This training will encompass all of the tasks the cadets have learned throughout the day.

(5) Phase III. Recovery. Begins upon the completion of training of the Corps of Cadets. The committee will account for and clean all equipment prior to turning it in to cadet supply. All brass, ammunition, and residue turn-in will be coordinated through the ASP NCOIC for turn-in at the conclusion of training. All holes, pits and wire obstacles will be filled-in or removed prior to leaving the site. The NCOIC will coordinate with Range Control to inspect the training site for final clearance.

b. Tasks to subordinate units.

(1) Cadet company training dates are 5, 6, 8, 9, 13, 14, 15, and 16, July 04.

c. Coordinating instructions

(1) Site Layout. See Tab A (Site Layout) to Appendix 15 (ITT).

(2) Training Timeline. See Tab B (Training Timeline)

(3) Minimum Essential Personnel Requirements.

(4) Cadet leadership will conduct leaders' recon 24 hours prior to the next days training.

(5) Cadet leadership will brief OIC/ NCOIC during the leaders' recon on concurrent training plan.

(6) Cadet leadership is responsible for teaching subordinates how to camouflage self and individual equipment prior to arriving to the range.

(7) All soldiers will arrive to the range camouflaged and prepared for training.

(8) Uniform. The uniform for training is BDUs, ballistic helmet, two (M16) ammo pouches, one blank adapter, and two small waterproof bags.

4. SERVICE SUPPORT. Task Force will draw equipment and general supplies IAW Appendix 3 (Equipment Draw)

a. Materiel and Services

(1) Class I: Cadets will bring MREs for lunch. The Task Force Cadre is responsible for providing chow for all TF personnel. A water buffalo will be requested by the site OIC by 27 June 04.

(2) Class II: TF personnel will pick-up OPFOR clothing from cadet supply during initial equipment draw.

(3) Class III: Fuel and lubricants will be provided to the cadets by USCC. The TMP will provide the TF personnel with fuel and lubricants.
